The Constitution of the RA	The Constitution of the Republic of Armenia (RA), year of amendment: 06.12.2015. The Constitution of the RA is the legal basis of the country, the supreme law of the country. Other laws and legal acts should unconditionally correspond to the Constitution. The Article 16 "The protection of the Family" draws crucial attention: it affirms that the motherhood and the childhood are under the special protection and safeguard of the state. The Article 30 puts forward that women and men are legally equal.
Family Code of RA	The family legislation puts forward the conditions and procedures of the marriage, marriage conclusion, and marriage cancellation, regulates personal non-property and property relations between family members, including that of spouses, parents, and children. The framework of the family legislation regulates the relations between other relatives and persons, stipulates the rules alternatives of family placement of orphans/ children deprived of parents.
Criminal Code of RA	The objectives of the Criminal Code are as follows: to protect from criminal encroachment human and citizens' rights and freedoms, the rights of legal entities, property, the environment, public order and security, constitutional order, as well as to prevent crime.

<p>Law on equal rights and equal opportunities for women and men of the RA</p>	<p>“Law on equal rights and equal opportunities for women and men” of the RA. The law stipulates to create equal opportunities for the exercise of rights and freedom of men and women in political, social, economic, cultural life and other societal domains, and regulates relations within these areas.</p>

<p>Law on Prevention of Violence within the Family, Protection of Victims of Violence within the Family and Restoration of Peace in the Family</p>	<p>This law stipulates legal and organizational grounds for prevention of violence within the family and protection of victims thereof, provide a definition of violence within the family, set forth the competences of bodies designated to prevent violence within the family and protect the victims thereof, identify the types of protective measures, grounds for their use, particularities of reconciliation of victims of violence within the family and perpetrators, and legal protection of information about the victims of violence within the family.</p>

<p>Convention on the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women</p>	<p>The term "discrimination against women" shall mean any distinction, exclusion or restriction made on the basis of sex which has the effect or purpose of impairing or nullifying the recognition, enjoyment or exercise by women, irrespective of their marital status, on a basis of equality of men and women, of human rights and fundamental freedoms in the political, economic, social, cultural, civil or any other field.</p>
<p>Convention for the Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms</p>	<p>Article 14: The enjoyment of the rights and freedoms set forth in this Convention shall be secured without discrimination on any ground such as sex, race, color, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, association with a national minority, property, birth or other status.</p>

<p>The Law of The Republic of Armenia On the Child's Rights</p>	<p>The law defines the rights of the child, the responsibilities of the government and corresponding bodies, enterprises,</p>

	institutions, organizations and citizens in protecting the Child's Rights.
RATIFIED INTERNATIONAL CONVENTIONS	
UN Convention on the Rights of the Child	The Convention defines a 'child' as a person below the age of 18, unless the laws of a country set the legal age for adulthood younger. The Committee on the Rights of the Child, the monitoring body for the Convention, has encouraged States to review the age of majority if it is set below 18 and to increase the level of protection for all children under 18.
